Born of Annie Blodwen neé Scotton (1885-1977) and Robert Twydale Atkin (1885-1963) "Aubrey" Atkin, he was educated at St. Joseph's College ("Marists Brothers"), Rondebosch (1924-1927) and at South African College High School (1931-1933). After he gained his matriculation, he worked for Kodak (SA) Ltd from August 1934 until October 1940 as "cine processing operator". After the WW II, he joined the South African Railways, working there as a clerk until retirement. He was unmarried.
