xiv The history of this gentleman is extraordinary. He is described as a Collector & Philatelist and "a wellknown resident of Kimberley in its very early days". He authored authoritative philatelic literature including the following: "The Bechuanalands; a brief history of the countries and their postal services to 1895" and "The Handstruck Letter Stamps of the Cape of Good Hope from 1792 to 1853 and the Postmarks from 1853 to 1910". The latter included unrecorded information about the Rouletted and bisected Stamps, Revenue Stamps used for Postal Duty, and various Bank cancellations found on the Triangular and Rectangular Stamps of the Cape of Good Hope. In 1941, the South African Library, Cape Town was presented with "Prints made from the original wood-block plates in the SA Museum, Cape Town, on 26th November 1940, to illustrate the 1861 wood-block issue in the Barbara Jurgens Collection of Cape Postal History. 2 prints mounted on card with printed caption". In 1948, he was admitted to The Philatelic Federation of South Africa Roll of Distinguished Philatelists of South Africa. However, circa 1949 another philatelist, Douglas Roth, investigated the nature of certain items of early Cape postal history that were appearing on the open market. It is generally accepted that Jurgens fabricated this material, employing genuine stamps applied to official-free stationery he had acquired and defacer postmarks of his own concoction. The unique A A Jurgens - Cape of Good Hope, Barbara Jurgens Memorial Collection -Cape of Good Hope, is housed in twenty volumes and "in storage" at the South African Cultural History Museum.

The memorial also bears the names of those who were lost or buried at sea, or who died at home but whose bodies could not be recovered for burial.
