THE FAMILY MOHL / MOLL and its relationship to MARAIS

Monday, 28 July 2003 supplemented Saturday, 26 January 2008, Monday, 09 August 2010

Meaning : diminutive of Molle : Moll = minor (German) = maid, young girl (Nederlands). Related to the English names Mall, Mallet, Mollet(t), Mollison

In the 1700's, 3 separate lines emigrated to South Africa: Dirk Mol from Amsterdam (1 offspring), Georg Ulrich Mol(1) from Hamburg (1 offspring), Cornelis Mohl from Neudamm (Nieuwendam / Niewen Dam) aan 't Y, Amsterdam (23 offspring).

In South Africa, spelling changed to Moll by the time the death notice of Cornelis Mohl was issued in 1837.

Those parts of the family who have been prominent in South Africa are thus for having excelled in the medical, legal and teaching professions. The name is widely dispersed throughout the country.

Cornelis Mohl of Amsterdam emigrated to the Cape as a chief sail maker and mattress maker in the service of the V.O.C. Many of his offspring were destined to become influential in Cape life. The Death Notice does not list all his children; and according to his will there were 5 children by the second marriage.

Cornelis Nicolaas (Claase) Mol was a minister of religion in Uitenhage and later Swellendam. Alexander Moll has in his possession "a large silver inkstand which was apparently made from the melted-down silver collection from a church service which celebrated the retirement of a Dominee Mol of Swellendam."

Passport issued to John Moll in 1882 by the British Foreign Secretary "to travel on the Continent". The will is signed by J J Marais. The estate was valued at £36937/8/5. In terms of the will, it would have been severely disadvantageous to JJM should she have re-married.

1.6.5.4.1 Pieter de Villiers Moll b 19 February 1889 d 16 July 1934 m. Ella IRSLINGER 1 March 1890 d 13 August 1980

Dr Pieter De Villiers Moll (b 1889 d Pretoria 16 July 1934 MOOC. 6/9/4466 No.42363) MD (Heidelberg) was appointed honorary visiting orthopaedic surgeon to GSH in 1927. Born in Paarl in 1899, he was educated in Paarl and at SA College graduating in 1916 with honours. He trained in medicine at Heidelberg and Munich. He married Ella Wilhelmine Irsslinger in Heidelberg. After World War 1 (during which he was a prisoner of war in Germany) he went to Scotland where he gained the LRCP&S (Edinburgh) and LRFPS (Glasgow) in 1919. Returning to Cape Town and private orthopaedic practice that year, he gained great popularity for his acumen. He joined Groote Schuur as an honorary surgeon (1927), clinical lecturer (1931). He was responsible for organising the Lady Michaelis Home Orthopaedic Home, acting as honorary superintendent until his death in a motorcar accident in Pretoria, aged 45 years and 5 months. His death notice states father as being "John J Mol"; and is signed A Marais Moll (brother). His estate was valued at £9400/15/6. He had one child, Jan Erik Moll.

Dr Abraham Marais Moll (b Paarl 1890's d 1957) was a medical registrar 1934-1937; clinical tutor 1938; honorary physician to GSH 1946; part-time lecturer 1950. He was a BA graduate of the SA College; retired as head of firm in 1954 to be succeeded by Helen Brown. He was temporary dean July - December1955. He was a physician of noted talent. He was a member of parliament for Rondebosch 1938-1948. He died in July 1957.

Dr Jan du Plessis Mol LDS (Edin) DDS (Penn). b c. 1895 d. 16 February 1924 aged 28 years and 10 months $\frac{\text{MOOC }6/9/2582 \text{ No.}369}{\text{No.}369}$ 7. He was a doctor of dental surgery in Paarl. Married to Mary Brown formerly of Edinburgh. He left her an estate of £4524/0/3. No offspring.

Marais is French in origin means a marsh, bog, swamp $\,$ or small garden. There are numerous villages in France with the name.

1. Charles Marais m Katherine Taboureux, le Plessis-Marle, Hurepoix.

Charles Marais from Lesierre du Plessis near Marle, and later Plessismornay near Longvilliers, a district of Paris, fled to the Netherlands where, on the 14 September 1687 in the Waalse Kerk, Den Haag, he renounced the Roman Catholic Church. He and his wife left Delfshaven on 31 December 1687 aboard the Voorschoten. Arrived in Saldahna Bay on 13 April 1688, embarking on the Jupiter for the trip Cape Town. He was stoned to death of 3 April 1689 on his farm Le Plessis Marle by a Hottentot, Edessah, following an argument centred around a green watermelon. He married Catherine Taboureux (d 1729) in France. In 1690, she married Daniël des Ruelles (d 3 December 1726) of Picardie, France

Charles Marais farmed Le Plessis Marle in Drakenstein and De Fortuin bought from Willem Adrian van der Stel and bordering on Wel van Pas in Wagenmakersvallei.

Anne des Ruelles arrived in the Cape in 1688 together with her parents, Daniel des Ruelles and Anne Goudalle

Daniel and family lived in Drakenstein, Stellenbosch district.
