

First a house that has been sold for one hundred guineas and five guineas more situate at Gracey le Chateau. About 13 guineas more are in the hands of my Cousin François Buzenet 19 who has been so kind as to take charge of my affairs and who has received this money for me but was unable to remit me same on account of the War between France and England. I am to

Dear Dr Pelteret,

Mrs Bayliss has returned your e:mail to me for answer and I have had time to look into some of your suggestions. Firstly, however, I note that: George Pelteret arrived on a ship under Captain Brodie early in 1835 bound as house servant to R.W. Eaton in Cape Town, as you confirm. The intervention of the Children's Friend Society is interesting in this context: it is to some extent surprising in that even at that date the surviving churches and Huguenot institutions were still in a position to look after 'their' children in need so that orphans and others in contact with 'Huguenot' authorities would not have had to fall into the hands of other organisations for care and placement. The names of several (needy) Peltier adults do appear in the Hospital records for the 18th century (as LIII below). I have, however, also now found a couple of Huguenot names in a list of children sent to Canada at the period so we can assume that there could be Huguenot descendants amongst their charges.

Now you refer also to medieval instances of the name. While it is possible for their to be linear connections between French families settling in England at that time and their collaterals in France becoming Huguenots in the 16th/17th centuries and having descendants settling in England at that time, it is not likely that one can trace connections between them; a Pelter of the 18th century would know no kinship with a Pelteret newly immigrating from France.

I have already sent you our leaflets and have now checked the indexes to our publications and you may find the variants at Franschhoek: Peltereau (Quarto series vol. XXVIII), Pelter (VIII: Thomas Pelter born in Roan [Rouen] in England 15 years, 1544: so pre-Reformation/religious persecution); Peltier (IV, V, VII, XI, XIII, XVI, XVIII, XXIII, XXVII, XXXIV, LIII), Peltrau (XI, XXI, XXIII, XXXIX). I do not find Pelteret as such.
