The Rev. C.H. Hutt. was awarded the Queens South Africa Medal (no bar)(inscribed REV.C.H.HUTT.P.C.DEPT.) for service to the Press Censor Department between 10 March 1902 and 22 May 1902.



Charles Herbert Hutt was born in 1872 in Lyons, Durham. His father was the Rev. Richard Goade Hutt of Haddesdon, Hertfordshire and mother, Emily of Cocking Sussex (d. 1925). He was a Clerk in Holy Orders at Chartham Rectory near Canterbury Cathedral. He was married twice; first to Florence Hutt who died 15 April 1912, leaving him with three daughters, second to Kate Hutt who survived him. He died 3 August 1932 in Worthing, England.

Revd Clive Barlow, Rector of Chartham (1992-2008) writes as follows:

I have extracted the following details of Revd C H Hutt's ordination and clerical posts held. The entries in Crockfords Clerical Directory do not indicate where he trained for the ministry but it's interesting to note that although he had considerable experience of ministry in South Africa, he was asked to serve in a curacy in this diocese before being appointed as Vicar of St. John's, Maidstone.

The Revd. Charles Herbert Hutt was born in 1872 in Lyons, Durham. His father was the Rev. Richard Goade Hutt of Haddesdon, Hertfordshire and mother, Emily of Cocking Sussex (d. 1925). He was a Clerk in Holy Orders deaconed in 1895 and priested 1899 Grahamstown, South Africa. Assistant Master Grahamstown Grammar School 1895 - 96; Succentor Grahamstown Cathedral 1895-98; Head Master Grahamstown Grammar School 1896-98; Curate: Kei Road, Cape Colony 1899-1904; (Awarded the Queens South Africa Medal (no bar)(inscribed REV.C.H.HUTT. P.C.DEPT.) for service to the Press Censor Department between 10 March 1902 and 22 May 1902.) Rector: Kei Road, Cape Colony 1904-06; Rector: Cambridge, Cape Colony 1906-09; Vicar: Maraisburg 1909-1912; Vicar: St Michael and All Angels, Pretoria 1912-16. Secretary: South Africa Church League 1916.

Curate: Betteshanger, Canterbury Diocese UK 1916-17; Vicar: St. John, Maidstone 1918-22; S.P.G (Society for the Propagation of the Gospel) Organising Secretary in Archdeaconry of Maidstone 1920; Vicar: St. Clement, Sandwich, 1922-1931. Rector: Chartham, Canterbury 1931-2. Final signature in Service Register is Evensong on Sunday 31st July, 1932. He died three days later 3rd August 1932 in Worthing, Sussex, aged 60. His death was recorded by Chartham Parochial Council (Minutes) 19th August 1932.
