588 Corpl. WILLIAM CHARLES WINTON Army Pay Corps

BACKGROUND:

The following research is prompted by the purchase of a Queen South Africa medal awarded to an unknown, Charles William WINTON, who lived and worked in De Aar for half a century.

During the Second Anglo-Boer War, Charles William WINTON served in the Royal Army Pay Corps, De Aar. Of his arrival, I have found no trace ⁱ.

For his service, he was awarded the Queens South Africa medal, bar Cape Colony, engraved and not renamed thus: 588. Corpl. C. W. WINTON. A.P.C.



He died a railway pensioner in Karroo Hospital, De Aar on the 6th May 1948.

ARMY PAY CORPS

The Royal Warrant giving effect to the creation of the *Army Pay Department* was signed by Queen Victoria on 22nd October 1877, with the Department becoming operational on 1st April 1878. This unit was constituted solely of officers from the Control Department and Regimental Paymasters who were responsible for the payment of soldiers as a main part of their duties.

Four years later its complementary organisation comprising of the military clerks (usually non-commissioned officers) was established and called the *Army Pay Corps*. Despite having different names, these two units in effect formed one branch of the service.

The Department and the Corps was to serve throughout the Anglo-Boer War (ABW) (1899-1902). As was the case with other systems during the ABW, the pay system broke down largely as a consequence of regimental officers inability to manage matters of war as well as the logistical nightmares and procedural complexities of British army bureaucracy.
