CECIL GERALDINE COCHRAN

The CORRESPONDENCE SERIES is an investigation into the background of recipients of British prestamped postal stationery. The "collection" was purchased in South Africa in 1999 as a job lot, the which took me six months to sort and mount, creating a collection spanning 140 years. I have no idea of the provenance.

The Reference work is British Postal Stationery, A K Huggins.1970. The first date with catalogue number refers to the year when the pre-stamped envelope was first issued; the second, the year when the envelope was actually used.

Col. Alexander Cochran * 1814 Ashkirk, Roxburgh, Scotland † Bath 1903 m. (first) Bath June QRT 1847 Fanny BATSFORD of Cheltenham. Cochran lived at Ashkirk House; and owned property at Inveresk.

Ashkirk Mill formerly was a corn mill in Ashkirk, a small village in the Scottish Borders. The owner-miller in the early 18th century was Sir Walter Scott. It was part of the property of Alexander Cochrane in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. In the Transactions of the Highland and Agricultural Society of Scotland 1866-1867, the List of Members includes Alexander Cochran (1861)

Holbrook Grange: Sir Edward Boughton, pulled down Lawford Hall and sold the manor to John Caldecott in 1793, (fn. 90) who built Holbrook Grange and was lord of the manor until 1835. From him it passed to Charles Marriott Caldecott, whose daughter Merriel, widow of Charles Godfrey Bolam, held the estate in 1937. Holbrook Grange is a listed building with the following address: Holbrook Grange, Chapel Street, Long Lawford, Rugby, Warwickshire

The Thunerhof was built in 1875 as a Grand Hotel by the Baugesellschaft Thun to a design by Adolphe Tièche of Bern. An imposing, meticulously laid out building, its design incorporates French Neo-Renaissance forms including a prominent tower, grand stairway with open galleries. It ceased to be a hotel 1934; and since 1942 has served as the Thun City administrative seat of government. Since 1948, the art museum of the City of Thun has been located on the ground floor.

From correspondence received from descendents, it would appear that the Miss Cochran recipient of this mail is likely to have been Cecil Geraldine Cochran born Sept QRT 1865 district Hastings (Reg. Vol. 2b Page 27).

I quote:

"(I) have visited Ashkirk, and have special paintings of Switzerland painted by Cecil Geraldene [sic] Cochran (my grandfather's sister) - she never married"

Saturday, 23 July 2011 Further note:

The daughter of an Alexander Cochran († c. 1963) who lived at Ashkirk, Selkirkshire, Scotland was a Flora Cecil (* circa 1865 † Bournmouth Mar QRT 1929) married 19 October 1926 in Kensington, London Ninian Lowis/Lewis ELLIOT (* 4 April 1861 Saint Ninians, Stirling, Scotland † 1935, son of Augustus John Elliot & Helen Lewis/Lowis and member of the Elliots family of Minto). She was his second wife, his first, married March QRT 1896 in St George Hanover Square, having been Emilia Margaret GUTHRIE (b. 1858 d. 5 July 1924).

It seems likely that the Alexander Cochran referred to above was Alexander Charles Purves Cochran
