WILMOTT HENDERSON EVANS and ANN FRANCES PIERCY EVANS

The CORRESPONDENCE SERIES is an investigation into the background of recipients of British prestamped postal stationery. The "collection" was purchased in South Africa in 1999 as a job lot, the which took me six months to sort and mount, creating a collection spanning 140 years. I have no idea of the provenance.

The Reference work is British Postal Stationery, A K Huggins.1970. The first date with catalogue number refers to the year when the pre-stamped envelope was first issued; the second, the year when the envelope was actually used.

Philatelic Description of the item of Postal Stationery:

King Edward VII: Newspaper Wrappers - Post Office Issue (WP21). Issued December 1904. Size 127 x 300mm. Straw coloured paper with two corners cut off. Addressed to:

Dr Willmott Henderson Evansⁱ (1859-1938) was consulting surgeon to the Royal Free Hospital and to the Hospital for Skin Diseases at Blackfriars. Educated at University College, London, and trained at University College Hospital. B.Sc.Lond. (1880), L.S.A. and M.R.C.S. (1883), M.B., B.S. (1885), M.D. (1887), elected F.R.C.S. (1890). At first he headed for a career in occupational medicine, later changing direction and becoming a surgeon. He was a demonstrator in anatomy at University College; surgeon of the King George Military Hospital; joint lecturer in surgery at the London School of Medicine for Women; Erasmus Wilson Lecturer of the Royal College of Surgeons. Publications included a translation of the "*Handbuch der Prophylaxe*", The Diseases of the Breast, A Handbook of the Diseases of the Skin, and Medical Science of To-day.

In 1896, Willmott Henderson Evans married Dr (Mrs) Ann Frances née PIERCY in Marylebone, London. Together they had three sons and two daughters (three of whom became doctors *). These were:

Dr (Mrs) Ann Frances Piercy Evansⁱⁱ ⁱⁱⁱ (1867-1940). In 1883 she attained the University of Cambridge Examination Senior Certificate; from 1884 to 1893 was educated London School of Medicine for Women; MB Honours in Medicine and Obstetrics, with an Exhibition and Gold Medal in Materia Medica, a Gold Medal in Anatomy and Honours in Physiology; registered as a medical practitioner in 1893. She held the following posts: Assistant Registrar of Medical Women, Assistant Medical Inspector to boarded out children at Dr Barnardo's Homes, Assistant Anaesthetist at the Royal Free Hospital, Clinical Assistant at the New Hospital for Women, Demonstrator in Anatomy at the London School of Medicine for Women; and was a Member of the Anatomical Society

The family resided at 121 Harley Street, London between 1911 and 1929, where after they moved to Sidcup, Kent.
