# MESSRS WHITFIELD KING

The CORRESPONDENCE SERIES is an investigation into the background of recipients of British prestamped postal stationery. The "collection" was purchased in South Africa in 1999 as a job lot, the which took me six months to sort and mount, creating a collection spanning 140 years. I have no idea of the provenance.

The Reference work is British Postal Stationery, A K Huggins.1970. The first date with catalogue number refers to the year when the pre-stamped envelope was first issued; the second, the year when the envelope was actually used.

#### Philatelic Description of the item of Postal Stationery:

1895 (RP21F)\_Messrs Whitfield King, Lacey Street, Ipswich 1895 (actually used from Ipswich MY12 98)



Charles William King (aka. Charles Whitfield King) was born in Ipswich in 1855  $^1$ . Whitfield King & Co., Ipswich, was established 1869. Sometime after 1881, he married, Leah Hamby (1858- circa 1944) (do. George Henry Hamby and Hannah Elizabeth Tunmore)  $^2$ . Together they had at least one child, Charles Whitfield King in the September QRT 1887  $^3$ . He died in Ipswich in 1930  $^4$ .

And what of his name? The unsuspecting journalist (ref. 1) states the following: "Double-barrelled surnames are so much *de rigeur* amongst our leading stamp dealers that it is no great surprise to find that Mr. Whitfield and Mr. King are one and the same person. In short, "Whitfield

King & Co." is really only Mr. Charles Whitfield King. " One can only suggest that C W King aspired to an eminence that his baptismal name did not suggest, hence his adopted appellation.
